BOOSTER-CURIOUS

about vaccines

You may connect with patients who are *curious about boosters*, or who received their first vaccination for COVID-19, but have since become more hesitant to receive a booster. It's important to explain to these patients how boosters work, and the value of keeping up to date with vaccines as the virus mutates.





What's the real story about the boosters?

START BY SAYING...

The need for a booster shot doesn't mean the COVID vaccines aren't working.

A booster dose helps maintain your level of protection as immunity may decrease over time.

Even if you've already had COVID-19 and recovered, you should still get your booster dose.

KEEP IN MIND

How boosters work. Point patients to easy-to-understand resources about COVID-19 boosters

This isn't the last booster, because the virus continues to evolve. Explain to patients that they can expect future COVID-19 boosters.
